The Prayer of Consecration

The prayer is concluded with everyone praying the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

The Invitation and Indication of the Elements

The Communion

You may come forward to receive the elements from the Pastor; the assisting elder will usher you forward when it is time. If you do not wish to receive the elements, cross your arms over each other as a signal.

During the communion, the soloist will first offer Lamb of God by Allen Pote. The text: O Christ, Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, have mercy on us. Dona nobis pacem. Give us Your peace. Amen.

Then the organist will lead us in devotion. When it's time to conclude we will sing stanza one of *Jesus Loves Me* (Hymnal 709).

The Prayer after Communion (prayed together):

Almighty God, You provide the true bread from heaven, Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Grant that we who have received the sacrament of His body and blood may abide in Him and He in us, that we may be filled with the power of His endless life, now and forever.
